**The Obstacles & Treasure Guards:** Each activity will be approximately 1 hour long and conducted in a round robin style.  
Moments of Lost -GPS/Compass- (9th)  
Knots Tying Rescue -Knots- (28th)  
Water Race -Canoes- (12th)  
Siege Weapons -Arts & Crafts- (17th)

Emergency Shelter -Building Shelter- (7th/11th)

Catapults/Slingshots -Pioneering- (19th)

Medical Mayhem -First Aid- (33rd)

Campfire -Campfire- (17th)

**Aye Aye, Mate!** The participant from each group will be divided into competition patrols. They will be going through all the activities together as a group to further mingle and know each other. Outside of the round robin activity time, the groups will be staying together at their site.

**Let's Count the Treasures** Each station leader will be given coins (color coded) that worth 1, 2, or 3 points to award to each youth participating in the activity. The leader must award the youth with one coin **only** but the leader may wish to give different value of coins to different youths within the same competition patrol based on their performance. The evaluation will be based on the team work, co-operation, spirit and the skills demonstrated in the activity. There will be treasure coins hidden campsites. Also, bonus points will be awarded for having extra pioneering project for the group. The coins will be submitted, then tallied on Sunday morning and averaged by the number of participant participating in the camp.

### WHAT TO BRING:

Suggested packing list

**Tailor the gear to the camp & planned activities**

**Label your name on everything!**

- Tent & ground sheet (we can provide if needed),
- Back Pack (approx. 70 liter size) – lined with large plastic bag
- Uniform (shirt and scarf to be worn to and from camp)
- Sleeping bag (preferably in a compression stuff sack attached to your pack)
- Foamie or sleeping mattress
- Pillow
- Ground sheet tarp (1.5m X 2.0m size)
- Sleeping pad (self inflating foam mattress or closed cell foam)
- Waterproof jacket, pants, hat and hiking boots (CHECK WEATHER CONDITIONS)
- 2 complete changes of clothes (shirts, pants, socks, underwear, etc.)
- 4 pairs of socks
- Sleepwear/pajamas (sweats pants, sweatshirt w/hood if possible)
- 1 toque - polar fleece recommended to keep your head warm at night if necessary
- 1 pair of lightweight gloves - polar fleece recommended
- Toiletry kit (towel, soap in container, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb/brush, washcloth, deodorant, etc.)
- Sunglasses for sunny days, canoeing or kayaking
- Ball cap or brim hat - (must be worn at camp)
- Flashlight (includes fresh batteries)
- Compass and whistle - all camps
- Knife (lock back pocket knife or small fixed blade camp knife)
- Dippy Bag c/w carabineer hanger (mess Kit in mesh bag) containing plate, bowl, mug & cutlery.
- Clothes peg (to clip your dippy bag up)
- Cook Pot set in bag c/w carabineer hanger - one metal fork and spoon required
- Extra plastic bag or two - for wet clothes, dirty laundry, etc.
- Personal First-Aid/Survival kit
- Folding Camp Chair - all camps
- Swimming gear: towel, water shoes, swimsuit, beach shoes
- Sunscreen, Banana Boat (After sun lotion), Bug repellent

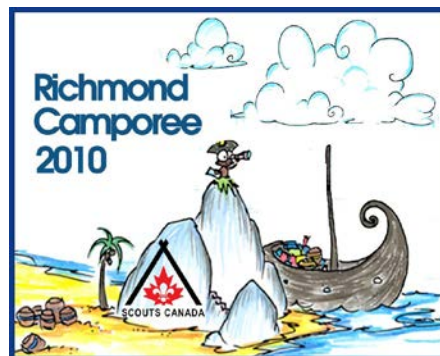

Scouts Canada - Camp Cove  
@ Harrison Lake (Mission side)

The best way to get to Camp Cove is to follow:

- Hwy 1 to Abbotsford, take the Hwy 11 North route to Mission, then Lougheed Highway (Hwy 7) East to Harrison Mills.
- About 5km past Errock, start looking for the intersection of Morris Valley Road on your left. The intersection forms a sort of a triangle with Sasquatch Inn standing in the middle of it.
- Camp Cove is approximately 21.5 km from Sasquatch Inn. Since there are very few landmark points on the road past Weaver Creek, it may be a very good idea to take note of your odometre when you reach Sasquatch Inn.
- Follow Morris Valley Road to the Weaver Creek Hatchery. This section of the road is paved. The remaining section from the Hatchery to Camp Cove is a rough logging road so please drive with care (as some of the areas can climb steeply and there may be soft edges on the roadside). Reminder: Camp Cove is approximately 21.5 km from Sasquatch Inn.
- 

**A Very Important Tip:** Set your odometer to 0.00 as soon as you turn off Lougheed Hwy 7. The drive is about 30 mins from Lougheed Hwy to Camp Cove driveway.

- Set your odometer and watch the right side of the road as you approach 21.5 km)
- The driveway down to the campground is not easy to see from the road. It will be on your right side just before you come under BC Hydro powerlines.
- Start looking for it after you have passed a beautiful vista of Harrison Lake on top of a steep cliff.

- Start checking for the yellow metal gate (across Camp Cove entrance) when your odometer reached 21.1 km's.  
- It will be on your right hand side just before you come under BC Hydro powerlines.  
- Up to Weaver Creek Hatchery the road is paved, the remaining section is a rough logging road.  
- Drive carefully as some of the area can climb steeply and there may be soft edges on the roadside.  
- The Driveway down to the campgrounds is not easy to see from the road.  
- The road is narrow and only one way traffic and has a steep incline down to the lake area. It's less than 5 minutes drive to the campsite.  
- Please park your car leaving space for other vehicles (see where other vehicles are parked) and come join the camp.
